II. Free and Low-cost Legal Advice and Representation

Quebec Bar Association's low-cost consultation with a lawyer

- Cost of a consultation with a lawyer varies between \$50 and \$60 depending on your region

- This cost is only for an initial consultation. If you ask the lawyer for further services (for example, further consultations or for representation) you must reach an greement regarding fees.

Quebec Legal Aid

- Provides free (or in some cases low-cost) legal representation for low-income people in all regions of Quebec.

Juripop

- Provides legal consultation and representation in most areas of law at \$60 per hour for people who slightly exceed the financial cut-offs for Quebec Legal Aid.
- The request must be made online, with proof of income.

- Provides four hours of legal consultation and advice for victims of sexual abuse and domestic violence
- · Service is free of charge regardless of your income
