What's the difference between legal information and legal advice?

It's sometimes hard to tell! This info sheet aims to help you understand the difference.



IT'S OKAY TO PROVIDE

- General information
 about the law and the operation
 of the legal system.
- Information based on a simple reading of the law.
- Information about

 options and possible outcomes
 in a given situation, that is, what the person
 could do and what might happen as a result.
- Information that helps someone to identify that their situation involves a legal issue and that they may wish to seek legal advice or a legal opinion.



LEGAL ADVICE

(OR LEGAL OPINION)

YOU SHOULD NOT



State how the law applies to a person's **particular situation**.



Provide an **interpretation of the law,** that is, something that requires more than a simple reading of the law



Recommend a particular course of action, that is, provide an opinion on what a person should do and/or their chances of success if they choose a certain option.



Give the impression that you are providing **expert legal advice** to help someone decide what course of action to take.
